#### TIGNANELLO

Marchesi Antinori Srl is an Italian wine company that can trace its history back to 1385. They are one of the biggest wine companies in Italy, and their innovations played a large part in the "Super Tuscan" revolution of the 1970s. This was the first Sangiovese to be aged in barriques, the first red wine to be blended with non- traditional varieties. The wine is aged in barriques for about 12 months then in the bottle for a further 12 months. Tignanello is a milestone.

# Pape Clement Rouge 2009

Chateau Pape Clement is one of the oldest properties in Bordeaux.

Planted in 1305, the estate is the oldest planted vineyard in the region. It received its name from Bertrand's papal name, Clement V. On his election to Pope in 1306 he gave the estate to his successor as Archbishop, Cardinal Arnaud de Canteloup. He then moved the papacy to Avignon near Château Neuf-du-Pape where he planted this original vineyard with red wine grapes. The vineyard was one of the first to plant vines in rows to facilitate tilling, which was paramount to the horticultural revolution. Pape Clement continues each year to delight wine lovers. On average, the vines are 30 years of age that produce this beautiful wine.

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### Amerone della Valpolicella, 2007

Amarone della Valpolicella is produced primarily from the red Corvina grape in the Valpolicella zone of Veneto, Italy. Amarone is unique in its production: the Corvina grapes are dried for about three months before being pressed and fermented dry, producing a wine that is concentrated and high in alcohol.

## CERETTO BLANGE, LANGHE ARNEIS DOC

The Arneis was among the first ventures undertaken by Bruno and Marcello Ceretto. It was 1985, a time at which it was difficult to envision a white wine in a land of great reds. For Ceretto however it was a challenge and so the first vineyard was purchased on the hillside of Vezza d'Alba where this rare grape variety proved to be much more than just a new addition to the Ceretto collection. This famous white, fruity with a bit of effervescence is appreciated worldwide. Arneis means "rascal in local Italian dialect because of how difficult it is to grow.
